Course Overview:

Welcome to AP Literature and Composition. This year-long course will focus on the big ideas and understandings of AP Literature and Composition: Character, Setting, Structure, Narration, Figurative Language, and Literary Argumentation. We will be studying these ideas by examining short works of fiction, poetry, longer works of fiction, and drama. We will also be doing a lot of writing. You can expect processed pieces of writing as well as many timed writings.

Course materials:

You will need to bring whatever text we are working with on a daily basis. You will also need your Chromebooks, paper, and pen. We will be reading a variety of texts this year. Because of how the course works, we have a lot of freedom with what we want to read. Here is a list of the texts that we will all be doing in no particular order:

The Great Gatsby by F. Scott Fitzgerald
Frankenstein by Mary Shelley
The Catcher in the Rye by J.D. Salinger
Beloved by Toni Morrison
In the Time of the Butterflies by Julia Alvarez
The Road by Cormac McCarthy
William Shakespeare Play (Most likely A Midsummer Night's Dream this year)

These are a few of the major works we will focus on, but there are likely to be more. It really depends on how things go. There will also be independent works as well as a lot of poetry. I will send out weekly emails that let you know what we will be reading. If you have any questions or issues with the materials we are reading, I need you to let me know in advance. We will also discuss audiobooks and how to use them appropriately.

In addition, I am going to strongly recommend that students purchase copies of the novels we read this year. It is by no means required, but it makes doing annotations much easier. I will discuss this more in class and give you an accurate price point.

Course Policies:

<u>Late Work: Late</u> work will be accepted at a 10% deduction per day up to a maximum of five days. Do your best to turn assignments in on time. If there is a problem that arises, please communicate with me and we will arrange accommodations.

<u>Plagiarism and Cheating: Plagiarism</u> will result in an immediate zero on the assignment and further repercussions. Cheating will result in a zero on the assignment.
