## **AP Human Geography: Post National Exam**

Students did phenomenal finishing their national exam. As noted before, this was the highest percentage/turnout of students that opted to test on national testing day in my tenure. As we work toward the final weeks of school, below is an overview of where we are headed. We have a chance to dive a bit deeper into content previously learned, but due to lack of time allowing further exploration, we can now focus on a few key items missed, in Unit IV.

As planned, students completed a country portfolio that acted as a warm up to additional country portfolio, highlighting South Africa. This will allow further connection with the geographical location, allowing them to connect with the Apartheid era and Nelson Mandela. We will take a look at events leading up to collapse of the government and what took place after. To do this, we will explore through text the history, watch the film, Invictus, and have a guest speaker, Ika Emmons as our culmination to the unit.

<u>Rationale</u>: AP Human Geography Unit IV: Race, Ethnicity, and Nation. There is a vast segment on the apartheid era in this unit.
