

ART RULES & EXPECTATIONS

ALWAYS BE PREPARED TO DO MY BEST:

- Be in the classroom when the final bell rings to begin class.
- Drop backpacks, books, and heavy coats in the designated area. You may pick them up after you are cleaned up for the period.
- Come prepared every class period with a pencil, eraser, and sketchbook.

RESPECT MYSELF, OTHERS, AND THE CLASSROOM:

- Please do not show disrespect towards each other, staff members, or guests.
- Do not misuse or damage tables, supplies, equipment, tools, or materials.
- Please do not use other student's art supplies or get into another person's art locker without permission.
- Snacks and drinks are to be consumed in the designated area, not at the art tables. (except water bottles)

TAKE TIME TO CLEAN UP AND PUT EVERYTHING AWAY PROPERLY:

- Please clean up after yourself and put everything away exactly where it belongs.
- This is **your** studio space to work in, if there is something out of place or damaged please let me know right away.
- Storage: All unfinished artwork should be placed carefully in your portfolio, on the drying racks, or in your locker (depending on the project). Sketchbooks and your art supplies can stay in your art locker.

IT'S IMPORTANT TO LISTEN WHEN THE TEACHER IS TALKING:

- Be ready to listen to daily instructions after attendance is taken.
- Technology is distracting. No cellphones are to be out once the class is started unless you are given permission to have them.

STAY ON TASK UNTIL TOLD OTHERWISE:

- Do not clean up until the teacher asks you to. You are expected to work a minimum of 40 minutes in class.
- Wait at your table until the bell rings. Do not wait in the doorway or the hallway.

TOLERANCE FOR NEGATIVE BEHAVIOR IS A ZERO:

- Do not create or talk about: symbols, images, signs, logos, words related to drugs, alcohol, racism, hate speech, inappropriate language or anything else deemed inappropriate for a public school setting or the viewing public.
- Do not leave the room unless you have permission.
- This is your classroom; be responsible, be respectful and be a learner!

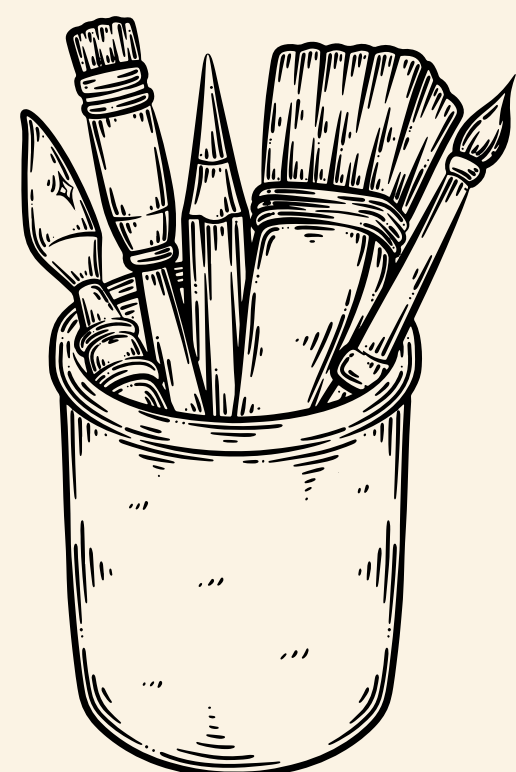
