Dear Parents, Teachers, and PEAKers,

During our short week, students were hard at work on two main tasks: writing their original Egyptian-themed mythological stories, and then depicting these stories in an online graphic story creator called Pixton. We have a variety of results; some teams are basically done, and some are still in the beginning stages. Students should know how to access both projects from home, and we encourage any who are feeling a little behind to log in and get some work done if possible. Please let us know if you have any questions.

This week we'll be continuing this work with the hopes of finishing everything! Also, we'll be traveling to Ancient Egypt with a category list called "The 18 Areas of Humans". This document lists all areas of human civilization, and students will research various areas to better understand what life was like halfway around the world 5,000 years ago! They'll first conduct internet research, and then share out to the group what they've found. We'll also be discussing proper research protocols and how to cite sources.
