- All the work we do in class matters! I want you always to give your best efforts. You should NOT have homework. The only homework that you may have is if you were absent or need more time to finish a classroom assignment. Remember, everyone works at a different pace and some students need a bit more time. <u>All classwork/homework assignments will be worth 40% of your overall grade. All assessments, tests, and writing will be worth 60% of your final grade.</u>
