Welcome to Geography Class with Mr. Elder here at C.R. Anderson Middle School! I understand that many of you are a bit nervous about entering this new stage in your life and that grades are one of the biggest concerns you have. Here is what I can tell you about grading in our geography class.

We will have a number of units this year, each of which is very different, but each of which is structured in much the same way. We will have an introductory activity to get us thinking about the subject we're studying. We will learn some key vocabulary related to our topic, and will also do an activity or exercise that helps us better understand the unit's essential question. I will sometimes check or score your work in these stages of learning. These practice scores will fall under the 'Assignments' Category, and will be worth 40% of your course grade.

The final portion of each unit centers on student performance. It will be worth 60% of your course grade. For the 'Assessments' category, you will generally either complete a project to share with others or take an assessment that allows you to share what you've learned from the unit.

What if... I am not happy with my performance on an assessment? This can happen. If it does – you have options! Any student may decide to *redo, correct, or finish completing any practice we did in the unit* (the 'Assignments' work) on their own. Students have one week from the original assessment date to complete the retake process (which varies unit to unit) and thus improve their grade.

Late Work Policy.

Be advised that Mr. Elder is working with over 120 students. The more work students complete and turn in *on time*, the better our year will go. I will check a number of assignments for completion and progress during the course of a unit. If you are not keeping up with classwork, history suggests you will fall behind and struggle with unit assessments!

My primary focus is on our class's current tasks and planning next steps. Late work will be accepted through the end of each unit for full credit, but it is your teacher's lowest priority. *If you turn something in late, it might be a few weeks before that work is evaluated and is updated in PowerSchool.*
