To understand each of the inquiry units, we will explore each topic through a variety of ways. For example: Lecture, podcasts, readings (*both primary and secondary*), case studies, video, imagery, testimony, map & graph analysis. We as a class will also utilize various forms of writing, including performance tasks, annotations, and literacy-based activities.

Analyzing our subject matter will become a large part in helping us understand why it is important to know how the examination of social sciences within designated regions can and do affect our planet on a very in-depth scale.
