Course Summary

This course is designed to provide students with learning tasks and opportunities to study American history from the Constitution/Manifest Destiny to the present. Emphasis is placed on vocabulary, critical thinking, and interpretation of original documents as aligned to Montana state and C-3 Inquiry Based Learning Standards. Through lecture, discussion, debate, role play, and simulations, students will participate in a variety of class activities to develop a better understanding of where the United States has been and key issues that have shaped its development. Emphasis on continued progress towards proficiency in individual student reading and writing skills will be class goals so multiple assigned opportunities should be expected. It is important to note that students are expected to continually develop their Geographic, Civic, and Current Issues awareness as well.

TCI – *History Alive!* The United States Through Modern Times (online curriculum), "America the Story of Us" (History Channel), "The Men Who Built America" (History Channel), and various other digitally delivered resources and applications.

How will students be assessed?

<u>Classwork</u> will consist of using the online TCI Interactive Notebook, various handouts, maps, and various short writing activities (bell ringers/exit tickets). <u>Assessments</u> in the form of traditional quiz/test, vocabulary assessments, written response assessments, and projects will account for the remainder of the students' grade. Grades are determined by dividing the total points you earned by the total that was possible with the appropriate weight for the two categories being assigned. The grading scale will be 90-100 is an A, 80-89 is a B, 70-79 is a C, 60 –69 is a D, and 0-59 is a F. Check your grades often to make sure you have everything in, and it is what you expect it to be.

What can students do to raise their grade?

The goal in this Social Studies class is to ensure that students master the essential standards for the class, so any efforts to raise a student's grade will have the same goal. Options include correcting assignments, enrichment, and/or test retakes. **KEEP IN MIND:**

- All reassessments must be done within a reasonable time of when the grade was posted to PowerSchool.
- Reassessments must be pre-arranged. I will not accept a reassessment without prior knowledge and without first discussing it with you.
- Test retakes must be completed at school either in Advisor, at lunch, or in a study skills class with teacher supervision.

STUDENT HINTS FOR SUCCESS!

- Attendance: Please be here and be on time. The more time you spend in class the more we can discover together.
- <u>Participation:</u> Since your active engagement in lessons will dramatically impact your learning, I expect you to be fully engaged throughout each lesson. I will do all I can to keep the lessons engaging, fast-paced, safe, and fun.
